


## TRUTH ABOUT ISRAEL PART TWO

## The Abrahamic Covenant

In Genesis 12:1-7 "1 Now the LORD had said unto Abram, Get thee out of thy country, and from thy kindred, and from thy father's house, unto a land that I will shew thee: 2 And I will make of thee a great nation, and I will bless thee, and make thy name great; and thou shalt be a blessing: 3 And I will bless them that bless thee, and curse him that curseth thee: and in thee shall all families of the earth be blessed. 4 So Abram departed, as the LORD had spoken unto him; and Lot went with him: and Abram was seventy and five years old when he departed out of Haran. 5 And Abram took Sarai his wife, and Lot his brother's son, and all their substance that they had gathered, and the souls that they had gotten in Haran; and they went forth to go into the land of Canaan; and into the land of Canaan they came. 6 And Abram passed through the land unto the place of Sichem, unto the plain of Moreh. And the Canaanite was then in the land. 7 And the LORD appeared unto Abram, and said, Unto thy seed will I give this land: and there builded he an altar unto the LORD, who appeared unto him."

When you think of a covenant between God and mankind you must understand several things.

- 1. God's Covenants are bilateral agreements between God and man.
- 2. While they are bilateral God never changes His mind nor does He break Covenants.
- 3. If a Covenant is Breached (Broken) it is done so solely by the man God entered into the Covenant with.
- 4. Within Scriptures The Covenant proceeding the current Covenant is always rolled into the next Covenant. God made a Covenant with Adam called the Edenic Covenant. This Covenant was about obedience. This Covenant was rolled into the Abrahamic Covenant where Abraham was not told to obey because that Covenant was already established with man (Abraham).
- 5. Covenants are made between God and man that cannot be assignable or transferrable to another party. They are inherited. Past down from one generation to the other. Inherited Covenants cannot be changed.

A Covenant is what we term today as a contract. All Covenants have basically six parts.

- 1. Preamble
- 2. Prologue

- 3. Stipulations
- 4. Document clause
- 5. Witnesses
- 6. Sanctions

So, when we look at the Abrahamic Covenant we find God promised to Abraham to be a great nation. We

also find that that great nation did not come to fruition with Issac nor Yacob (Jacob) but through Yacob sons. If fact, the great nation was a Hebrew people made up of twelve (12) tribes called nation states.

The twelve (12) tribes are identified by the names of the twelve sons of Yacob (Jacob). The twelve sons form the basis for the twelve tribes of Israel, listed in the order from oldest to youngest: Reuben, Simeon, Levi, Judah, Dan, Naphtali, Gad, Asher, Issachar, Zebulun, Joseph, and Benjamin.

Not one of the twelve tribes took the name Israel, and they were not collectively identified as Israel. So, the question is how we went from the twelve (12) individual nation states to one state called Israel? We will get to that in a later post. But what we have to realize is that God did not name a nation state called Israel. The grouping of the twelve tribes are the people (the generations) of Yacob (Jacob) who God named Israel.

Let's compare today's map of the State of Israel with the map of the twelve tribes. No where on the current State of Israel map do you see of the twelve tribes contained within the map. What is that? If Israel is the biblical Israel and it was nation a single nation state then where are the twelve tribes that make up the genrations of Yacob (Jacob)?





Lets take one more view of the Middle East Map. If you look carefully at the most recent map of the Middle East you would find that Israel is separate from Judea. Wait a minute. If Israel is to be the biblical Israel and Judea was one of the sons of Yacob (Jacob) would it not be that Judea ought to be part of Israel?

So, if you look just as facts contained in how the Middle East is divided the only one that is truly biblical is Judea. Israel neither contains the other 11 tribes and is completely set apart by government from the state of Israel. This is of itself reason for not only concern about what we have been taught and believe but it greatly establishes a biblical divide in the generations of Yacob (Jacob) known as a group of people called Israel. If anyone of these two territories has a claim to a biblical positioning for the land provided by God to Abraham it would Judea.



This alone is enough to question everything about the state of Israel without looking at any more truth. One must now take a very large step backwards in time and look at the history of the state of Israel versus the Nation of Israel (Yacob's generation of twelve sons). Please remember as we go forward that God's Covenants cannot be broken or changed. Given this, we need to ask ourselves a lot of questions about how the state of Israel was formed, its reason for formation, and what was its role in geopolitics that moved us into the world conditions today.
